Rung 4

Rung 3

Label the mountain ranges of the UK and the tallest mountain in that range.

Children may need help with spelling some of the names.

Rung 2

Label the mountain ranges of the UK

Encourage children to use a capital letter for each of the labels. Which country is the range located in?

Rung 1

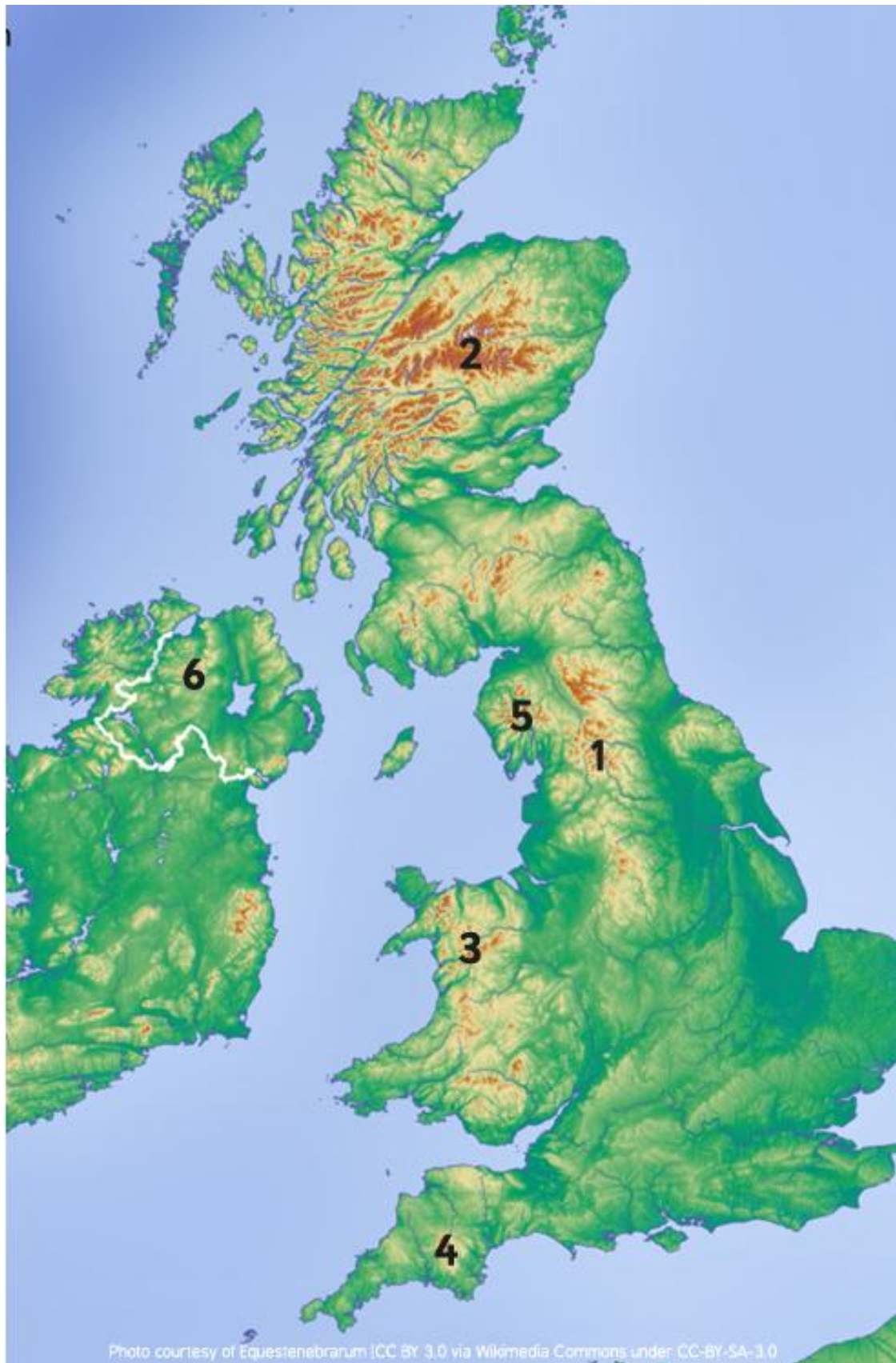
Point to the mountain ranges of the UK

Remember, keep sessions short and fun.

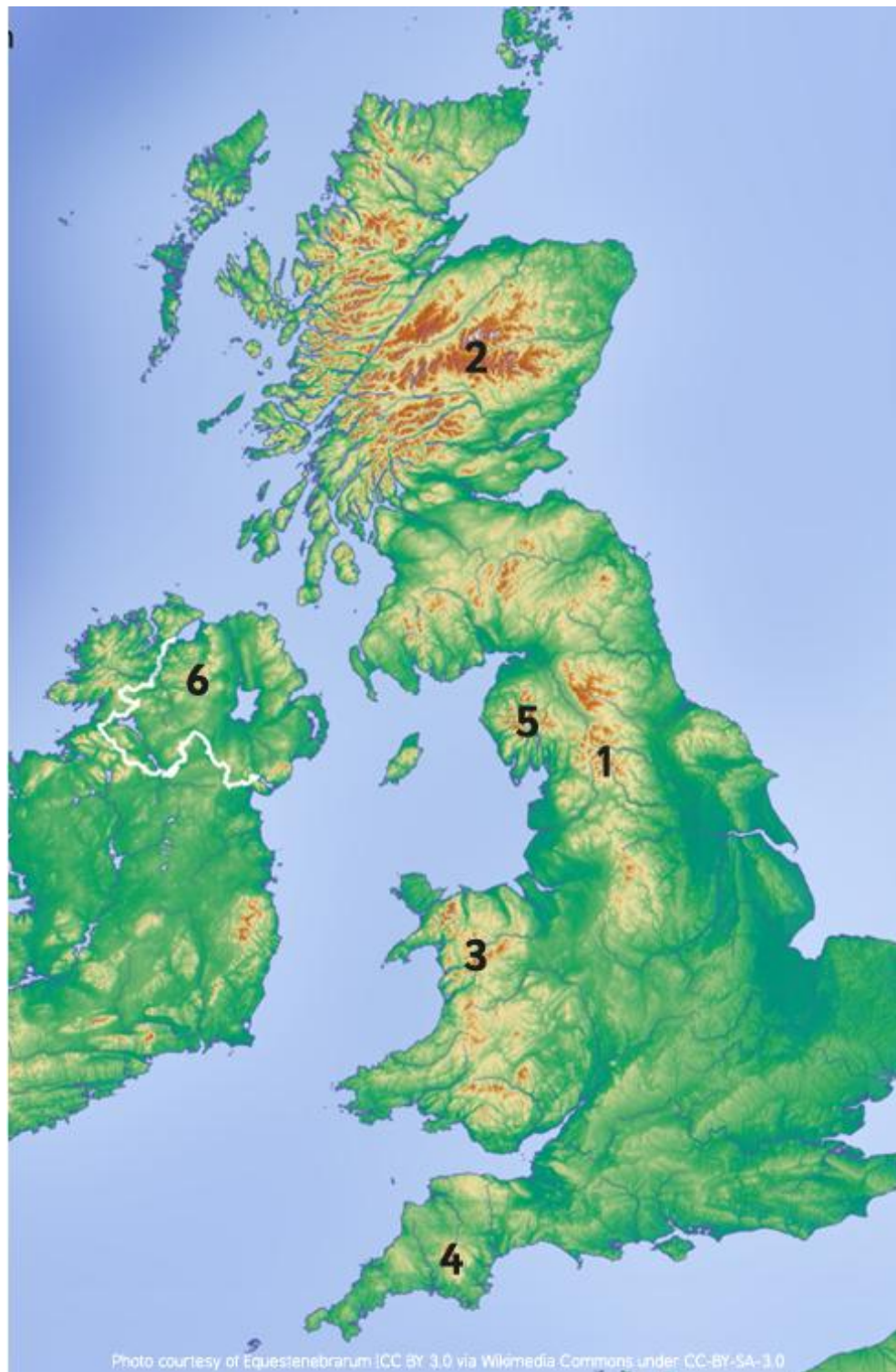
